About the Project - The project will be focussed on developing a scalable model of integrated emergency and injury care at Health & Wellness centre to strengthen post-crash response by conducting assessments and developing model intervention packages for both HWC & community.

The global total addressable deaths and DALYs that can be averted amount to 24.3 million and 1023 million lives respectively. In South-East Asia alone, 90% of deaths and 84% of disability-adjusted life years (DALYs) are due to emergency and trauma conditions. Road Traffic Injuries are one of the major leading causes of deaths in India. RTIs alone contribute to more than 1.5 Lakh deaths annually with an estimated loss of 3-5% GDP.

The operational guidelines of Comprehensive Primary Health Care states that the service delivery framework of Health and Wellness Centers is divided in 12 service delivery packages, of which 7 packages will have direct impact by the integrating emergency care system.
