About the Project - The project will be focussed on developing a scalable model of integrated emergency and injury care at Health & Wellness centre to strengthen post-crash response by conducting assessments and developing model intervention packages for both HWC & community.

The global total addressable deaths and DALYs that can be averted amount to 24.3 million and 1023 million lives respectively. In South-East Asia alone, 90% of deaths and 84% of disability-adjusted life years (DALYs) are due to emergency and trauma conditions. Road Traffic Injuries are one of the major leading causes of deaths in India. RTIs alone contribute to more than 1.5 Lakh deaths annually with an estimated loss of 3-5% GDP.

The project site will be PHC of Udaipur; the selected coordinators will have to stay most of the time at the PHC of Udaipur and will also get the opportunity to work with community by conducting community survey, train the community on post-crash response to prevent road accident deaths.
