



About the project:

Globally 90% of all deaths and 84% of all disability –adjusted life years (DALYs) are caused due to conditions with emergency manifestations. This includes NCDs (cardiac, strokes, others) injuries, communicable diseases and maternal and child complications- all contributing to the emergency care burden.

The project is based on baseline gap assessment and training of trainers for strengthening Emergency and Trauma Care System.

The gap assessment will be done under two broad categories: (a) Record review and interview based (b) Live observation of the real time care processes on key performance indicators.

Training of the trainers from all medical colleges will be done at JPNATC, AIIMS, New Delhi.
